This panel will explore the legal and public health implications of the recent executive orders and executive policies implemented by President Trump related to Freedom of Expression, Health and Immigration. A panel of interdisciplinary experts will discuss what those executive actions and memoranda mean, how they are being implemented, and what challenges they present from a civil rights and health equity perspective.
