

Master of Laws (LL.M.)

- Students must earn a minimum of 24 credits
 and complete the following courses:
 - LL.M Legal Research (1 Cr.)
 - LL.M. Legal Writing (2 Cr.)
 - Intro. to the U.S. Legal System (2 Cr.)
- Additionally, students must enroll in one course from the following list:
 - Civil Procedure (4 Cr.)
 - Constitutional Law I (3 Cr.)
 - Contracts (4 Cr.)
 - Criminal Law (3 Cr.)
 - Property (4 Cr.)
 - Torts (4 Cr.)
 - Criminal Procedure (3 Cr.)

Students may stay for a third semester with the intent of completing an experiential learning program or preparing for a U.S. bar exam.

International Exchange

- One semester program, based on tuition waiver.
- Students can enroll in most any course on offer, subject to capacity.
- Courses are graded and transcripted but transfer equivalencies will depend on the home institution.
- Students must enroll in a minimum of 12 credits, but no more than 17 credits.
- Exchange students are invited to participate in all aspects of academic and campus life, including student organizations.
