Prof. Jeffrey Dodge Associate Dean, Academic Affairs


Dean Dodge has taught and presented on topics related to family law, LGBTQ+ rights, and education law.

School of Law.












Doctor of Juridical Science (S.J.D.)

- Residency: All S.J.D. students are required to be in residence for one academic year.
- Candidacy. To move into Candidacy, each student must pass an oral defense to an appointed Candidacy Committee, which usually takes places at the end of the first year.
- Dissertation. Each candidate must produce an original dissertation that should be an original and significant contribution to legal scholarship.
- Defense. Candidates are expected to successfully defend their dissertation within two years after achieving candidacy to an appointed Committee of Examiners.





Residency

- One year residency required, preferably during year one.
- Students are encouraged to remain in residence throughout studies.

Coursework

- Required to complete Research Methods (2cr.) and Research Colloquium (2cr).
- Required to remain in fulltime status throughout studies.

Candidacy

- In order to move into candidacy, students must pass an oral defense to a Candidacy Committee, usually at the end of the first year.
- Requires
 "Candidacy
 Submissions".

Annual Progress Report

- Candidates must submit an Annual Progress Report in May each year.
- The faculty supervisor and the S.J.D.
 Program
 Committee will review and deem
 satisfactory or unsatisfactory.

Dissertation Defense

- The faculty supervisor will recommend to that a candidate be advanced to the final dissertation defense.
- The candidate must defend the dissertation to a Committee of Examiners.
