SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarly Focus: The vast majority of my scholarship addresses issues related to lawyer regulation, globalization, and the legal profession. Despite the rapid pace of developments, this is an underdeveloped academic field and relatively few academics have a similar scholarly focus. My scholarly goals vary depending on the particular article.

My articles include: 1) "<u>transparency</u>" <u>articles</u>, designed to bring certain lawyer regulation developments into the public domain for discussion and debate; 2) "<u>mapping</u>" <u>articles</u> that examine (often at great length) an important new development that is not widely known; 3) <u>commentary and "reflection" articles</u>; 4) <u>reform proposals</u>; 5) <u>teaching- related articles</u>; and 6) <u>"outreach" articles</u>. (I have written some <u>miscellaneous articles</u> that do not fit into any of the categories listed above.) In addition to producing my own scholarship, I have arranged for publication of four global legal practice Symposium issues that included articles about developments that were not widely known.

These articles appear in the law reviews at Georgetown, Northwestern, Fordham, Vanderbilt, Hofstra, and Minnesota law schools, among others and in journals such as LEGAL ETHICS. I have given talks at a number of foreign universities, including Oxford, the London Institute of Advanced Legal Studies, the University of Groningen in the Netherlands, Freiburg, Cologne, and Bremen Universities in Germany, and the Riga Graduate School of Law.
